City of Miami Provides Funding For Marine Stadium Piling Study

In November of 2011, the City of Miami Commission unanimously approved \$175,000 as a match to the FIND Commission (Florida Inland Navigation District) Grant for an analysis, design and permit study of the seaside pilings and sea wall of the Marine Stadium. This important study is fundamental in fully determining the cost and scope of work required for restoring the pilings and seawall. Once this scope of work is completed, the City can re-apply for Find Commission funding for the actual reconstruction work.

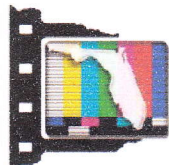
In the last 1 1/2 years, we have given approximately 35 presentations about the
